KSMXC Round 3 Wroxton

Kensworth Schoolboy Motocross club met on the weekend at the Oxfordshire circuit of Wroxton. The track owners had, as always, made a brilliant effort of preparing the track and this proved to have superb levels of grip as the first block of racing got underway.

The smallest capacity class of the day saw a valiant struggle at the front as David Gordon and Brandon Douglas shared wins throughout the day, a momentary lapse on the Chequers in the first moto was enough to gift the win to Gordon overall. Joe Butter had a great day for third and was visibly quicker as the day went on.

The 65cc Class was also hotly contested as again the wins were shared between Jack Evans and Harvey South. Jayden Wooloff just pipped a super fast Aaron Threader for the final spot on the podium. All the youngsters displayed superb bravery launching their machines off the fast uphill jump and had many of the watching parents wincing as they hurtled past.

In the Small wheels 85's Jacob Hennessy took 3 straight wins, but the battle for the other places on the podium raged behind as title contenders Tony Saunders and Joe Tobutt's CRF150's scrapped it out with the screaming 85cc of Connor Halligan. Saunders eventually finished Second and Tobutt Third.

A somewhat depleted big wheel group tore up the track and for what they lacked in numbers they made up for with pace. Ben Huckerby made the most of the rapidly drying conditions and his sweeping lines around the berms were proven to be the way to go, as he trounced the others with 3 straight wins. Huckerby had his hands full though as Alex Harvey and a super smooth Rossi Stout kept him on the move. Jack Gregory again proved he has the credentials as a title contender, but was let down in the first with a blown pipe. Joe Newcombe and Callum Adams had their own little war all day, as they scrapped it out behind.

The Schoolboys was as always worth a watch Dale Evans was a man on a mission and took all three wins but the battle behind was at times heart stopping Josh Stewart and Tommy Meads were battling hard for Second and come the end of the day only one point separated the two. Ben Jeffs was always snapping at their heels and only finished 2 points behind Meads,

The Under 35s again saw the hard Charging Paul Edge take all three wins but James Barnwell and James Barney made him work for it. Doug Thompson found the by now hardpack and dusty circuit more to his liking as he snatched 3rd place on the day, by virtue of a better finish in the last race, from Barney.

The Overs had a clear winner in Mark Boswell, Richard Wright finished second despite literally being buried by bike with Rob Mead in the final outing. Hard racing Keith Andrews managed a good Third overall despite almost constant attention from Trevor Bird and Warren Tatterall.
