Kensworth Schoolboy Motocross club met at the weekend at the Oxfordshire circuit of Arcott, the meetings sponsor had made a great job of preparing the track following the Annual fun day the previous day the improvements to the circuit proved to be a success and a true credit to the hard work put in.

The Under 35s were first out and as they hit the wood chipped first turn the action was red hot as the main title contenders battled for position. An unusually bad start for championship leader Jason Meads left him outside the top 5, however some flat out circuits with an on fire Paul Higgins, Richard Lewis and flying John Flack saw him claw his way up to second spot just behind leader Anthony Carrington. A stall on one of the circuits tight turns prevented Meads further advance and the moto finished Carrington, Higgins and Flack in Third. The following two motos saw Meads dominate from the front but despite a 4<sup>th</sup> place in the final Moto Carrington had done enough for a brilliantly hard earned overall.

Next out were the 85's and a the combined grouping of Big and Small wheels really put a cat amongst the pigeons as front runners from both groups clashed bars around the tight circuit. Jack Gregory was on from to take overall in the Big Wheels from Rossi Stout with Ben Huckerby in third. Jacob Hennessy took the honours on his Small wheel from Tony Saunders and Danny Cooper posted a season best 3<sup>rd</sup> overall.

The over 35's saw straight wins for Darren Moffit, Moffit definitely didn't get it all his own way as Richard Wright more than kept him busy as the pair literally screamed through the pack. A well deserved third overall for Neil Ferris was the result of some fantastic tight racing.

The 65s saw Jack Evans take 3 maximums and he was chased home by Harvey South these two are going to be good to watch for the remainder of the year as they race it out with Jayden Wooloff for the championship honours, Wooloff was just off the podium as another Huckerby, Lewis, snatched third overall on the day.

The Autos again saw a great display by Brandon "Flying Scotsman" Douglas, Brandon won all three motos, but it was never a foregone conclusion as Ollie Hennessy and Sam Chamberlin were never far away and no one would have put money on the outcome of the races as the KTM mounted trio flew around the ideally suited track. Just off the podium were Joe Butter and Zac Barker.

Schoolboys were the hot action again and saw some fierce riding Luke Houghton was maximum man with 3 from 3, Jack Lansbury second and Tommy "Gun" Meads was third overall.
