

KSMXC Club Championship Round 4
Wooloff in sheeps clothing

Kensworth Schoolboy Motocross Club held the fourth round of its 2009 club championship at a new venue near Daventry on Sunday 3rd May. A fast and dusty track made way for some fast and furious racing.

In the autos Brandon Douglas put on a great show taking the first maximum of the day with some very fast and stylish riding. Pocket rocket Ollie Hennessey must have had some turbo flakes for breakfast and pushed Brandon all the way in the first race despite being on a small wheel auto. Brandon upped the pace in races two and three and headed home with a bit more air between them. Matthew Peck put in three solid rides to take a well deserved third place.

In the 65's young Jayden Wooloff set the pace and took home three wins for all his hard work. Aaron Threader pushed hard all day and was rewarded with a fantastic second place. Last place on the podium was fought out between Kristian Hutchings and Kathryn Booth, eventually going to Kristian after both put in very strong rides all day.

In the Small Wheel 85's Tony Saunders started the day on top form taking his maiden victory in this class in race one. Jacob Hennessey followed him home in second despite hitting the deck a couple of times. In race two and three Jacob upped the pace and took the wins in motos two and three giving him overall victory. Hard charging Tony was always there or thereabouts giving the spectators some great racing to watch. Connor Dickens, Daniel Cooper and Jordan Anderton all finished in a podium place at some point in the day, eventually finishing in that order.

In the Big Wheel 85 class the pace was hot. Henry Gilbert took three classy wins, but Ben Huckerby pushed him hard early on in each race finishing with a trio of second places for his efforts. Third place was a very close fight between Max Hind, Ross Stout and Jack Gregory. There was little to choose between the three riders who gave their all, eventually finishing in that order.

In a large field of Youth125/250F's the pace was red hot. Luke Houghton started the day well with a win closely followed by a flying Chambers Whittle. Chambers stepped up a gear in races two and three taking both wins and the overall. Jamie Scott, Ben Jeffs and highest placed 2-stroke rider, Jordan Hind all flirted with the podium places through out the day eventually finishing in that order.

In a very fast under 35 Adult group James Barnwell came out on top taking a classy maximum. Doug Thompson was never far away securing a strong second place. Jason Meads, Yan Edwards and James Allsop put on a great show finishing in third, fourth and fifth respectively.

Last but not least was the over 35 Adults. A strong performance from Mark Boswell saw the final maximum of the day with three comfortable wins. Mark Gillingham, Richard Wright and Keith Andrews all had good strong consistent rides finishing in second, third and fourth respectively throughout the day. A quick mention for a rapid Lee Walton who had a cracking weekend finishing in fifth place.
