However Jacob didn't have it easy as Tony Saunders pushed him very hard giving the spectators some great bar bashing action to watch throughout the day. In the Big Wheel 85 class Jordan Wills took home three good wins. He didn't have it all his own way as fast starting Ben Huckerby pushed him hard, but a couple of wipe outs cost Ben valuable points. Once again Jack Gregory, Ross Stout, Callum Adams & Max Hind battled it out in each race with Jack coming out on top of this group with a fantastic second place overall.

In a large field of Youth125/250F's Ben Jeffs came out on a mission and set a scorching pace taking the first two wins. However a last race incident robbed Ben of the overall win meaning he only secured a disappointing third place for the day. Jamie Scott rode consistently well all day securing second place overall, but it was consistent Tommy Meads who nabbed the overall victory on his 2 stroke after three solid rides including a win in the last race. Charlie Ripplingham also rode his socks off all weekend including a second place finish in the final moto.

The under 35's saw some very close race action throughout the day. Super fast Luke Spence came out on top eventually with two wins, but James Barnwell pushed him all the way literally finishing inches apart in some of the races. Michael McClurg was also right on the pace taking a win in moto two and third overall.

In the over 35's it was Rob Mead that set the pace, taking all three wins in style. Richard Wright was also on top form with a brace of second places and a third place giving him a well deserved second place overall. Warren Tatterall was always there or thereabouts taking the final podium position.
